SET 03: Power in surrender – Part 1

Welcome to Grace Notes. We're in the middle of a series on power. On our last program we closed with the story of the apostle Peter's encounter with the Risen Lord. Today we'll see how Christ's resurrection transformed Peter's life. Barbara Sandbek will discuss the power of the resurrection and the power we can receive as we surrender our lives to God.

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The best illustration I can think of to help me understand why Peter denied the Lord, and how he felt afterwards, was in my own life. When I was turning six, my mom said she was going to give me a birthday party and invite lots of people. The day before my birthday, my sister told me to stay out of her room because she was going to wrap my present. Curiosity got the best of me so I peeked through the crack in the door. To my surprise, she pulled her wallet from the drawer. Now, to a girl of any age a wallet is a precious commodity. You can create a picture album in it, hide all your special notes in it, carry your wad in it, and look very much in control. But I didn't have a wallet yet. I was excited.

The day of the party was here. We sat in a circle with me at the head. I opened the presents – each one was better than the other...and brand new.

I looked down to see Patty's box...but I was ashamed of it – it was used. I quickly opened it while everybody was talking and laid it to the side without passing it around. I've never forgotten that I rejected my sister's sacrificial gift.

I believe the apostles followed Jesus initially because they knew He would be King and they could rule with Him. The idea of a crucified, USED-UP man hanging on a cross was offensive. Peter was not only afraid to side with Him, he was embarrassed.

It wasn't until the resurrection that Peter was ABLE to understand that Christ didn't have to die. He had the power to thwart their efforts against Him, but He chose to die to demonstrate His love in a compelling way.

The apostle Paul understood this. In 2 Corinthians 5:14-15 he said that Christ's love compels us – so much so that we should no longer live for ourselves but for Him who died for us and rose again.

After He was raised from the dead, Jesus sought out Peter and asked him three times if he loved him. He gave Peter the opportunity to reconfirm his allegiance, once for each denial. Jesus demonstrated the power of his LOVE through His PERSONAL forgiveness of Peter's sin against him...and Peter received it.

There is incredible power in the love of God. Paul said that we need to pray for power to even begin to understand His love. He wrote in Ephesians 3:16-19...

"I pray that out of God's glorious riches He may strengthen you with POWER through His Spirit in your inner being so that Christ may dwell in your hearts through faith. And I pray that you, being rooted and established in love, may have power, together with all the saints to grasp how wide, and long, and high, and deep is the LOVE of God and to know this LOVE that surpasses knowledge."

God's love for us sent his only Son, Jesus, to the cross. Jesus' love for us paid the awful penalty of our sin. God's love for us raised Christ from the dead, so Christ could unite us with the Father forever.

God will meet you where you are and show you his love in whatever way you need to see it, if you but ask. Then you, like Peter, will understand the Power of His love for you.



If Christ wasn't resurrected, we'd be dead in our sins!
Christ's resurrection completes our Salvation package.

Romans 5:9-10 says we're justified by Christ's Blood, reconciled to God through His death, and saved through His life!

Christ's resurrection brings eternal hope.

1 Corinthians 15:19-20 states...If in this life only we have hope in Christ, we are of most men most miserable. But now is Christ risen from the dead, and become the first fruits of them that slept.

Christ's ascension to Heaven brought the power to us.

Jesus told His followers that it was necessary for Him to return to His Father in Heaven, so that He could send the Counselor, the Holy Spirit, to indwell them and give them the power they needed to stay true to God.

Christ's resurrection brings change.

This power enabled cowardly Peter to speak before the most noted leaders in the land, blasting them as murderers. In Acts 4:20, when told to be quite or else, he said, "We can not help speaking about what we have seen and heard."

What made the difference? God birthed His Salvation in Peter through the power of the Holy Spirit. He didn't have to work FOR his salvation – in fact, he couldn't - Christ completed the work, but he yielded himself fully to the Spirit's working in him.

Philippians 2:12 says we should work OUT our salvation with fear and trembling.

Why fear and trembling? Fear is an awesome reverence and respect for God who has the power to grant us eternal life. We should tremble with excitement to know that God's grace can be fully accomplished in us as we surrender ourselves in obedience to Him.

So why don't we surrender? We know we should.

The apostle Paul wrote in Romans 7:21, that there's a struggle inside us all. He said...

What I want to do I don't do, and what I don't want to do I do.

And, we're there, too.

The power of the Holy Spirit is INOPERABLE in us unless we choose to crucify the US.

RESURRECTED LIVING requires DAILY DYING.

How? Paul gave us the answer in Galatians 2:20. He said...

I am crucified with Christ nevertheless I live, yet not I but Christ liveth in me. And the life I now live in the flesh I live by the faith of the Son of God who loved me and gave Himself for me.

God's power is UNLEASHED in us when we give HIM control.
