SET 09: Power in His presence – Come as a child

SONGS: Mercy called me by Name
My lips will praise You

INTRO: Welcome to Grace Notes. On our last program we learned that there is power in the presence of the Lord. It's THERE that we find joy and the joy of the Lord is our strength. Today, we'll hear more about how to enter God's presence, so let's join Barbara Sandbek as she shares.

When I was growing up, my dad had many hobbies – one of which was boating. I was a bit too young to appreciate it to the extent I would now, but one thing I did enjoy was going to the boat show. Dad liked to check out all the new models and I liked to picture what it would be like to have a playhouse in each boat. One time when my parents were busy discussing prices with a salesman, I wandered off, as any inquisitive child would do, and got lost. I didn't realize I was lost until I heard my name over the loud speaker. I don't remember being afraid at the time, but I would have been had my attention span met its limit. I must say, though, my parents were happier to see me than I was to see them.

We're so much like children when it comes to wandering from our Heavenly Father. Our eyes draw us away from Him just like Eve's eyes did in the garden of Eden. She SAW that the fruit Satan offered was good for food and pleasing to the EYE, and she and Adam ate it. When they did they became afraid and hid from God. Their choice brought sin into the world, and with it came both fear, and the inclination to withdraw from the Lord.

Our sin keeps us from coming into God's presence. We're so preoccupied with it that we don't even realize we're lost and need Him. In John 6:44 Jesus said...

"No man can come to me except the Father who has sent me draws him."

My dad called me when I was lost, because he loved me, God, too, calls us, individually by name, because of His great mercy.

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I cried the first time I heard that song. What a beautiful truth.

When we heed the call of the Lord, confess our sins, and earnestly seek Him, we can enter into the Lord's presence and expect to be rewarded, according to Hebrews 11:6.

Here are some of the rewards...

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In Isaiah 1:18 it says...

COME NOW, let us reason together says the Lord. Though your sins are like scarlet, they shall be WHITE AS SNOW.

Isaiah 55:3a reads...

Incline your ear, and COME unto me, hear and your soul shall LIVE. Matthew 11:28...

COME to me all you who are weary and burdened I will give you REST. John 7:37...

If anyone is thirsty let him COME to me and drink...and streams of living water will FLOW from within him.

Hebrews 4:16 says...

COME boldly to throne of grace that you may receive MERCY and find GRACE to help in time of trouble.

How should we approach a God so holy and powerful? - with childlike trust.

God never told us to be 'grown up' in His presence- rather to come as a child.

What attributes does a child have that God desires in us?

Humility – children know they have needs. The biggest barrier I had in totally surrendering my life was that I didn't want to admit that I needed the Lord. When I finally did, I found a real sense of freedom.

Children are inquisitive – eager to learn. When is the last time you explored a passage of Scripture you didn't understand?

Children expect to receive things. We, adults, on the other hand, hold our cup up to the Lord saying "fill it" and it's already full of our 'things' and our plans. A 'give me' attitude isn't all bad. God wants to give us good things – is there room in your life to receive them?

Psalm 147:11b says that it brings delight to the Lord when we expect Him to be kind and loving.

When we come into God's presence, he's even happier to see us than we are to see him. Here's why I think so.

When a child is born into a family there is a sense of awe and wonder. This human being is a part of you – your very own to raise and influence. You watch excitedly as they speak their first 'OO', and take their first step. You try to meet their needs. You train them and cry over them even before they can speak your language.

In Luke 15:10 it says that there is rejoicing in the presence of the angels of God over one sinner who repents. I figure since angels can't experience the joy that our salvation brings, it has to be Jesus who's doing the rejoicing. After all, He paid the price for our redemption. The pain suffered in physical childbirth is nothing compared to the pain Christ suffered to birth Salvation in us!

We're made in God's image. He placed Himself in US through the Holy Spirit. He's cared for us all along - before we were even physically born - before we could speak His spiritual language.

Do you suppose that God experiences even greater awe and wonder than we feel when someone is born into His family through salvation?

Etiquoite says that when we come to visit someone, we should bring a gift.

The greatest gift a child can give a parent is respect - to speak well of them, and praise them.

The greatest honor we can give God is to do the same.

We may make mistakes as parents, but God never does. He deserves all the praise we can give Him.

Fear not, for I have redeemed you, I have summoned you by name and you are mine.

Come to Him now, in childlike faith, bearing the gift of praise for all that He is to You – Your Abba Father – Your Daddy.
