Worship the Gift

INTRO: Welcome to Grace Notes.

We hope you've been enjoying our unwrapping of the gifts under the Christmas tree that Jesus came to give us. It's important to remember that none of these gifts are available until the most important one, Salvation, is opened and received.

John 3:16 tell us why. It says, 'For God SO loved the world that He GAVE (there's the gift) His Only Begotten Son that whosoever BELIEVES in Him shall not perish but have everlasting LIFE (that's Salvation).

Mankind is built for eternity. We will either spend it WITH God or WITHOUT Him. The GIFT Jesus died and rose to give us is offered INDIVIDUALLY and must be received to gain eternity with God. Why not start your NEW YEAR with Jesus in your life and receive LIFE ASSURANCE of eternity with God. There is no price man can pay for these gifts! Jesus paid it all.

JOY is the next gift our host, Barbara Sandbek, will describe for us. Enjoy all the gifts and don't forget to make that Christmas ornament marked 'JOY' for your tree.

Webster's Dictionary defines 'joy' both as a verb and a noun. As a verb, it means 'to enjoy; to have pleasure in the possession of.' As a noun, it is defined as 'the passion or emotion excited by the acquisition or expectation of good.'

The prophet Habakkuk used it as a verb in Hab. 3:18b: I will JOY in the God of my salvation.

The apostle Paul, in writing to the Believers at Thessalonica, used it as a noun in 1 Thess. 2:20:

You are our glory and JOY.

Once the 'something good' comes into our life (Salvation), our emotions are excited. We can then truly ENJOY and have pleasure in our possession of eternal and abundant life, and in the One who gave it to us (God through Jesus).

Life is meant to be enjoyed - not endured. This can only be done when we set our focus correctly and get our priorities straight. The formula is quite simple. Take the word JOY and break it down into three areas.

'J' stands for Jesus.

Keep your eyes first and always on Him; constantly recalling all He has done and is doing for you.

'O' stands for Others.

Putting others before yourself is not a natural thing to want to do, but when you chose to, you will experience great joy.

'Y' stands for You.

We should consider ourselves last in our thinking. This keeps us from getting wrapped up in our problems and becoming ineffective. As you seek to follow Jesus, you will see how He works in your life to bring you to that place of JOY.

Hebrews 12:2 says that Jesus endured the cross and considered the shame He bore NOTHING compared to the JOY He would receive in redeeming US for Himself. This overwhelms me.

The old Christmas carol says, 'Joy to the World the Lord is come'. Jesus, our JOY, has come TO US!

An angel appeared to the shepherds saying...

"Fear not, for behold I bring you good tidings of GREAT JOY which shall be to ALL PEOPLE. (both Jews AND Gentiles)
For unto you is born this day in the city of David, A SAVIOR, which is Christ the Lord."

1 Peter 1:8-9 says:

"Though you have not seen Him, you love Him, and even though you do not see Him now, you believe in Him and are filled with an inexpressible and glorious JOY, for you are receiving the goal of your faith, the SALVATION of your souls!"

Nothing brings more joy than to be in presence of someone who loves you. In the presence of the LORD there is FULLNESS of JOY. (Psalm 16:11 NIV)

Joy is not the absence of trouble rather the PRESENCE of Christ.

Nehemiah 8:10 reminds us that "The joy of the Lord is your strength."
